## Cedar House Life Change Center holds alumni day to celebrate 45 years of service

Community leaders also came to show support for Cedar House, which helps those suffering from substance abuse and associated disorders.

Assemblywoman Eloise Gomez Reyes, D-Grand Terrace, shared her insights on the impact Cedar House has had on the community.

Dan Flores, chief of staff for Supervisor Josie Gonzales, also attended and expressed their office's appreciation for the county's longstanding relationship with Cedar House.
